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


Low-Income Population in Our Service Area

Our Target Community

- Every community was our target, and within each we focused on specific places and neighborhoods.
- Crowded places were interesting targets for our team because of high possibility for flu contamination and transmission.
- Examples of crowded places are mosques, churches, public housing and residents buildings, markets and playgrounds.
- New arrival and refuges communities with language barriers were also targets for our team.
- Manet's Flu Equity team members reside in the community!

Manet Methods:

- Lectures
 Flyers
 Brochures
- Free flu clinics and/or education tables
 Individual and group education
 Others

- <u>Lectures</u>

The lectures were about the flu viruses, the ways of contamination and transmission, ways of protections, advantages of the flu vaccines and their types and what to do if someone get sick.

- Flyers

Different flyers in Chinese, Vietnamese, Arabic, Portuguese and English educating people what to do if they get sick and encouraging them to get the flu vaccine. We passed out thousands of flyers in different languages and places and by different ways such as:

*through <u>schools</u> by passing flyers to every student and asking them to show these flyers to their families, examples: ~Snug Harbor Elementary school in Quincy. ~Mutnafson Academy /Arabic school in Quincy.

*by passing flyers directly to people through our <u>hosted tables</u> at different places, examples: ~ Flu education table at Islamic Center of New England

- ~ Flu education table at Alforgan Islamic school in Quincy.
- ~ Flu edúcation table at Germantown /South Shore YMCA.
- ~ Flu education table at Thomas Crane Public Library in Quincy.

*through <u>frequently visited places</u> for target communities, examples:

International Halal) for Arabic,

Iranian, Turkish, Albanian, Greek, Pakistani and Indian people.

By passing flyers directly to <u>houses</u>. We have passed hundreds of flyers to most of the apartments in Germantown especially in the days before any event at that area inviting people to our flu clinics.

*Flyers and brochures available at the five sites of <u>Manet Community Health Center</u> especially in the waiting and education rooms for people to read or take to home to educate their families.

Brochures

We have brochures in different languages educate people about flu, and flu vaccine.

Free flu clinics

These clinics were for educating and vaccinating people at different places and occasions. Examples of places we have set flu clinics at them:

In addition we:

Passed out hand sanitizers – an important tool for preventing the spread of the flu

Gave handouts that includes information on prevention and access information to health organization people can contact for assistance.

Vaccination Care

- We tried to make Flu Shots easy and accessible!
- We held many free flu clinics at different places.
- We made flu shots available at all five Manet clinical sites (North Quincy, Houghs Neck, Snug Harbor, Hull and Quincy Medical Center).
- Many people we educated get their shots at different health centers other than Manet Community Health Center and our flu clinics.
 Our education backed up the message.

Vaccination

- Flyers and facts sheets of Flu vaccines were available at our Flu clinics for people when they decide to take their shots. These brochures and sheets describe advantages, recommendation, types of vaccines, side effects and other related issues.
- One week or more before any event we passed out hundreds of invitation flyers encouraging people to attend our flu clinics, examples:

Places of Events

- We had many events at different places for outreach, education and vaccination. These places were the best places to reach the mosaic of communities in the South Shore area.
- Communities we reached include Arabic, Vietnamese, Chinese, Portuguese, Spanish, Turkish, Persian, Indian, Greek, African American, etc.
- Examples of these places are Kam Man Market, China Pearl Restaurant, Islamic Centers, Quincy Career Center, Quincy Community Action Program, Interfaith Social Services Center and more.

Vaccination Care

- We also encouraged many of them to take the vaccine at our free flu clinic. Some decided to have the shot on site and some decided to consult their doctors first to see if they were fit for the vaccination or not.
- We were offered flu shots to people. We had educated many people attending events by directly speaking to them or by passing flyers and educational materials to them. Many students and employees were interested in our clinic. Many were very thankful for offering this flu clinic for public.

Flu Vouchers

- Our target was to give vouchers to all people without health insurance or awaiting coverage.
- Vouchers were also helpful to assist community members that were not at the moment able or "willing" to be vaccinated. Allow more time for community members to consider.
- Also, we distributed vouchers to people visiting Manet for health insurance related concerns due to many of them not having insurance or were waiting for their insurance to be activated.

Suggestions

- Provide more public awareness through TV, radio, newspaper and magazine ads in several languages to include Chinese, Vietnamese, Arabic, Spanish and English
- Make free flu shots available in the Fall and/or early winter months.
- Brochures, flyers and hand sanitizers to be available in the community in high foot traffic locations such as public housing buildings, T-stations, on trains and buses and in all local schools.
- Home vaccination visits made available to the elderly and disabled.
- Free flu shots for those people paying for their health insurance encouraging them to get vaccinated.
- Repeat messages annually
- Be portable, be mobile!
- Partners send positive messages MORE JOY!
- Respect flu myths
- Recruit staff from the community
- Nursing matters. Bring nursing talent
- Short term projects have impact. Develop structure that will support seasonal roll-out
