

# Overview of the Registry and Roll Out Status

Description of the MIIS MIIS data over time

When our body is infected with a virus or bacterium, our immune system will identify, target and often prevent the invading organism from flourishing and making us ill. While our biological immune system fights off infections to keep us healthy, our nation is also defending against disease outbreaks and keeping us as a population protected. Our nation's immune system, however, is not biologic, it is electronic and it has a name: Immunization Information System (IIS).

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## Overview

- Secure, confidential web-based system capable of electronic data exchange and direct data entry
- Consolidates immunization records over lifespan
- Assists providers with clinical decisions
  - Helps identify due or overdue immunizations
  - Prevents over/under immunization
- Includes practice management tools
  - Patient immunization and vaccine usage reports
  - Tracks over 3.2 million doses of vaccine distributed by MDPH annually
- Provides infrastructure for tracking essential information during public health emergencies

# Legislation

- Legislation passed in June 2010, charging MDPH to establish an immunization registry (M.G.L. c. 111, s.24M)
- /Mandatory reporting of all immunizations administered in MA
- Access given to healthcare professionals that administer immunizations, as well as schools, LBOH, WIC, and other state agencies' programs involved in immunizations
- The state registry of vital records and statistics shall transmit to the immunization registry the information regarding immunizations administered to a newborn
- Provider's Duty to Inform patients about the MIIS
   Patient's Right to Object to Data Sharing across providers

"Licensed health care providers administering vaccinations shall discuss the reporting procedures of the immunization registry with the persons receiving the vaccinations and their parents or guardians, when appropriate, and advise them of their right to object to the disclosure of such information as set forth in this section 4/27/2016

# 2015 Regulations

The purpose of 105 CMR 222.000 is to facilitate and promote the use of the Massachusetts Immunization Information System (MIIS) to help improve immunization coverage among all individuals in the Commonwealth.

# 12 Compliance Time Line

## September 1, 2015

• Providers who do not use electronic health record systems and will enter data directly into the web interface.

## **December** 1, 2015

• Providers who administer more than 1,000 doses of vaccine per year that use electronic health record technology and will report immunization information through electronic data exchange.

## June 1, 2016

• Providers who administer fewer than 1,000 doses of vaccine per year that use electronic health record technology and will report immunization information through electronic data exchange.

<u>Use case</u>: Your practice wants to work on some quality improvement measures. One measure is to increase your immunization coverage rates for HPV. Your practice has been reporting data to the MIIS for several months now. You log into the MIIS and run a coverage report.

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) Immunization Program is committed to promoting the health of Massachusetts' citizens by reducing the burden of vaccine preventable diseases that affect residents of the Commonwealth. As part of this effort, the MDPH Immunization Program has launched the Massachusetts Immunization Information System (MIIS), a web-based lifespan immunization registry and vaccine management system. The MIIS consolidates patient immunization information that is easily accessible by health care providers across the Commonwealth, who are then able to share these records with their patients and families. The MIIS helps ensure vaccines administered in Massachusetts are based on the latest immunization recommendations and provides patient and practice level reports to aid in the administration and tracking of immunizations. Additionally, the MIIS provides an online platform to manage and track the approximately 3 million doses of vaccine distributed by the MDPH annually.

By law (M.G.L. Chapter 111, Section 24M), providers must discuss the reporting procedures of the MIIS with their patients and their parents or guardians when applicable. The law also stipulates that patients and their parents or guardians have the right to object (or withdraw a previous objection) to having their or their child's data shared with other providers in the MIIS. This should be done after the provider practice has begun submitting data to the MIIS. The MIIS Regulations(PDF) describes the guidelines for all health care providers who are registered to use the MIIS. For more information on integrating the MIIS at your practice, please visit the ContactMIIS Resource Center.

<u>Gaining access to the MIIS:</u> To allow additional users at your practice to access the MIIS, your site's Access Administrator must log into the <u>ContactMIIS Resource Center</u>, identify the users and then ensure that they complete the necessary registrations steps.


All sites – including those that do data exchange – will need to access the web-based interface to perform some core MIIS functions:

- Vaccine ordering and inventory management













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## Legacy Load (Optional)

 Historical records may be added via HL7 or through a Flat File to ensure patient records are as complete as possible.

### Production Monitor

 Live data are transmitted to the MIIS with all patient records set to "Unknown" so it is not shared within the registry.

### Data Quality

• Clinical staff will look up 5-10 patient records for each site location. Staff will compare EHR record to MIIS record.

## Determine Go-Live

 If no issues are found during data quality, site will determine the date to go-live.

 Patient Informing and Data Sharing workflows should begin.

 Designated staff will follow MIIS workflow and manage data sharing status within the MIIS as needed.


 Quarterly data quality checks are recommended. Patient and Practice level reports are available to assist you.
